According to a study by Ranier Research, 70% of youth leave church by the time they are 22 years old.



These are just some of the questions that arise when analyzing why students leave their "faith roots." Experiential challenges to faith are real including academic (bias against Biblical Christianity or the idea of God in the classroom) and social ("party spirit" with great temptations toward alcohol and sex). These "stumbling blocks" often work in tandem to lead a young person astray.


